

Violinist Skye Park has performed across the globe including the US, Europe, and China since her solo debut at the age of ten with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Maestro Robert Trevino. Skye won the Jack & Lucille Wonnell Young Artist Concerto Competition performing Paganini's Violin Concerto No. 1 with the Blue Ash Montgomery Symphony Orchestra. She had a stunning solo performance at the Rising Stars Recital by the Laredo Philharmonic. She is the youngest prize winner of the Great Wall International Music Academy's Violin Concerto Competition, the second and third prize winner of the Young Artist Competition presented by the Association of the Louisville Orchestra, and two time winner of the Borchardt Concerto Competition by Central Kentucky Youth Orchestra. She has competed internationally at the Louis Spohr International Violin Competition in Weimar, Germany, Concorso Postacchini in Fermo, Italy, and Jeunesses International Music Competition Dinu Lipatti in Bucharest, Romania.

Skye has been featured on NPR's hit show From the Top, hosted by the acclaimed pianist Christopher O'Riley, which showcases outstanding young classical musicians. She first recorded with the show in Beijing, China at the Great Wall International Music Academy. Two years later, she performed once again for the show celebrating Starling Chamber Orchestra's 25th anniversary in Cincinnati, OH.

Skye is a devoted orchestral musician as concertmaster of Central Kentucky Youth Orchestra's Symphony Orchestra, Kentucky All State Orchestra, and Starling Chamber Orchestra. She will be performing in Carnegie Hall in New York String Orchestra Seminar's 50th anniversary season.

Skye has also excelled in chamber music as a full scholarship recipient of Starling Foundation of Houston at Bowdoin International Music Festival for the last four years and regularly performs in a string quartet through the Starling Project of Cincinnati. She was a guest violinist at the Chamber Music Festival of Lexington playing Mendelssohn Octet and Brahms Sextet No. 2 with the festival's artists including members of Philadelphia Orchestra and Los Angeles Philharmonic such as Nathan Cole. Skye has studied chamber music with members of Parker Quartet, Ariel Quartet, Calidore Quartet, Great Wall String Quartet, Earl Carlyss (Juilliard Quartet), and Ying Quartet.

Skye is a student of Kurt Sassmannshaus of College Conservatory of Music at University of Cincinnati, Margie Karp of University of Kentucky, and David Kim of Philadelphia Orchestra. She has received masterclasses and coachings by Anne Akiko Meyers, Juliette Kang, Martin Beaver, Gabor Takacs-Nagy, Robert Lipsett, Tessa Lark, and Nathan Cole.

Skye is a senior high school student at the Sayre School in Lexington, KY. Her favourite season is winter for she is an avid skier. Skye plays the 1751 Giovanni Battista Gabrielli violin.
